Fall 2018 Community Building Institute

Held twice per year, the Community Building Institute (CBI) series offers participants intentional, proven approaches to community entry, needs assessment, and ultimately creates high impact, community-driven programs and initiatives. CBI is based on the community-building framework, or "6 steps," that are used as a model for sustainable community development initiatives. This training includes six, hour-long sessions facilitated by experts in community organizing. Participants have opportunities to interact with trainers and are provided support materials and an optional certificate upon completion of the training.

The CBI Training Series is a crucial resource for the sustainable development of community-based initiatives. The six web-based sessions will take place every **Tuesday and Thursday beginning October 4**, **2018 through October 23**, **2018 from 11:00AM - 12:00PM Mountain Time.**
