

The Campus Election Engagement Project (CEEP) is helping Montana colleges and universities around the country mobilize students to participate in the 2020 Elections. In addition to this work, CEEP has secured funding to offer mini-grants for your campus activities and events ahead of the 2020 Elections.

Campus Election Engagement Project (CEEP) is a national nonpartisan project that helps administrators, faculty, staff, and student leaders at America's colleges and universities engage students in federal, state, and local elections. CEEP views voting as a means to promote a more equitable and inclusive democracy and to address past and present disenfranchisement. CEEP works closely with Campus Compact.

Selection of Campuses

Faculty, staff, students, and student groups are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to applications with a clear plan for their campus engagement efforts and who demonstrate financial need. Preference will also be given to community colleges and minority-serving institutions (MSIs) though not limited to.

Requirements

- Must be an affiliate campus in good standing of Montana Campus Compact;
- For full consideration, applications must be received no later than Monday, October 5, 2020, 11:59 p.m. Please email to Josh Vanek (vanek@mtcompact.org)
- Early applications are encouraged, and will be considered on a rolling basis;
- The funds must be utilized by November 6, 2020;
- Grantees must fill out a post-electoral engagement survey to complete requirements.
- The money may be used for outreach and events (virtual, hybrid or in-person), programs (posters, speakers, fliers, postcards, transportation costs, supplies), implementing voter programming such as voter registration into campus events, and/or to help with staffing costs related to engagement efforts. (For example, a new student assistant may be hired to work on electoral/democracy engagement and activities.) Moneys MUST be used for direct project-related costs ONLY. These funds are not able to fund current CEEP student fellows.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me. We look forward to working with you closely this election season to ensure you have the resources necessary to get your students participating in the elections and in our democracy.
